TASK DESCRIPTION / INSTRUCTIONS

Group Performance

Each student will collaborate with a group to devise, and perform in, a piece of original theatre. As a starting point for the Group Performance, students must choose ONE topic from the Topic List – Group Performance. This list of topics is published in the Drama Stage 6 Course Prescriptions available on the NESA website. The Group Performance will be a piece of original theatre which:

- is a complete theatrical statement demonstrating a sense of dramatic shape and structure
- provides an opportunity for each student to demonstrate his or her performance skills
- is performed by no fewer than three and no more than six students
- is 8-12 minutes in duration.

ONE topic to be selected by each group from the following:

- 1. Allsorts
- 2. Amigo/Ami/hombre/friend
- 3. Careless whispers
- 4. Critical Mass: the logic of collective action for common good or the minimum amount of fissile material needed to maintain a nuclear chain reaction or the amount needed to begin a new venture
- 5. Fire, Water, Earth, Air
- 6. The ties that bind
- 7. Set a course, get your bearings, anchors aweigh!

You will perform your group piece work in progress on the evening of CAPA Night, on Thursday 27th June, at 5pm in the hall.

You must have a script with cues for the technical operators



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You will be required to submit your personal group log book to your teacher.

The logbook should provide:

- a record of initial ideas shared
- a record of research and reading undertaken and how this contributed to the process
- an ongoing description and analysis of problems encountered and strategies used in finding solutions
- a record of constructive advice and comments received from audiences such as fellow students, parents and friends, teacher and assessors of works-in-progress
- comments on aspects of staging, lighting and design, where applicable
- a record of the final product.

FAILURE TO COMPLETE OR SUBMIT AN ASSESSMENT TASK

If you do not attend school on the Due Date of an Assessment Task to submit or complete the task in person you will be given a zero mark unless you comply with the following Assessment Guidelines:

- For Assessment Task completed at home you must submit the assessment task <u>before school on the next day you attend.</u>
- For Assessment Tasks completed at school you must report to the relevant Head Teacher <u>before</u> <u>school the next day you attend</u> and discuss when you will complete task missed or a substitute task.
- Complete a 'Misadventure Form' and provide relevant information and evidence to appeal the **zero mark** awarded. Other circumstances are outlined in the MAHS Assessment Booklet for the particular year. Evidence may include an in person medical certificate for illness or a letter outlining extenuating circumstances or other deemed reasonable reasons. An outcome of your 'Misadventure Form' will be provided by the Deputy Principal.



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Students found guilty of **malpractice** which includes plagiarism will be awarded a **zero mark**. If a piece of work is incomplete at the time of submission, it should be submitted as is, and you will be given a mark on what has been completed.
